50 participants.



## IN MEMORIAM: Kathryn La Fleur, SP

All of the WPC women mourn the death of Sister Kathryn La Fleur, past general superior of the Sisters of Providence of St. Vincent de Paul, Kingston, Ontario, and member of the Governing Board of WPC.

In Kathryn's welcoming greeting to her chapter last Easter, she called the community "to choose to live fully as long as Providence grants. We embrace and witness to our mission statement serving with compassion, trusting in Providence, we walk in hope. During these days may we be compassionate with one another, trust in Providence for the Spirit's guidance and walk in hope for the revelation of life-giving direction for the future."

Pauline Lally, SP, general superior, reflected on Kathryn at the celebration of her life. "Over these past four years Sister Kathryn lived in confidence within her reality... No pity parties for our Kathryn. She lived in great faith with a strong hope in her Provident God... She went to her treatments in an unbelievable upbeat fashion, giving hope and strength to the others who were receiving treatment with her... And she lived that kind of spirit for the whole congregation."

At Kathryn's invitation, Pauline missioned her during their last visit. "I mission you into the hands of Providence. And when you get to heaven, don't you dare forget us. Send us a sign with some roses or those purple flowers that you and St. Louise de Marillac loved so much."

"Believe it or not, the first flowers to arrive in my office after her death were a beautiful bouquet from the Women of Providence with purple flowers in them!"

## **Biblical Catechetical Program**

"The single most critical factor in an effective parish catechetical program is the leadership of a professional trained parish catechetical leader." NDC

The Missionary Catechists of Divine Providence have initiated a Biblical Catechetical Program to better respond to the needs of adult lay Catholics, especially Hispanic, who want to deepen their knowledge of Scripture. The program is composed of three main components:

- 1. How to Pray with Scripture
- 2. Scripture Formation
- Catechesis

The program begins with a weekend silent retreat to help the participants pray with scripture. The uniqueness of the Biblical Catechetical Program is that it combines scripture knowledge and catechesis,

which offers the participants a means to integrate scripture in their everyday life. Before each session, the group and the professor pray for about 20 minutes using the Ignatian method "Praying with Scripture."

Every book in the Bible is covered within the four- year program. The first year participants study Old Testament Foundations: Genesis through Kings, Year II study New Testament Foundations: Jesus and Discipleship, Year III- Old Testament Foundations: Exile and Restoration, and Year IV: Old and New Testament Concluded: The Word in the Hellenistic World. There are two options for people to participate: a three week intense summer course in June, Monday - Friday from 9 a.m to 5 p.m., or twice a month in September through May from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Presently, there are 14 summer participants and 17 during the school year. Participants include lay ecclesial ministers such as DRE's, Youth Ministers, Deacons, Religious, Pastoral Ministers and people who come for personal enrichment.



Comments from participants are: "The program is an invitation to journey deeper into the biblical text

and then to echo it to the community. I would recommend it to those who are at the point of their journey where they are willing to dissect the text; question, revalue and formulate new thoughts." Pastoral Minister

"This program exceeded my expectation. We not only learn to understand but apply it in our daily words and actions." Youth Minister.

# **Vocations and Vows Take the Spotlight**

Summer and early fall brought celebrations of Jubilees, first vows and vow transfers in Mother Joseph Province. Participants smiled and nodded as The Most Reverend William S. Skylstad, Bishop of Spokane, noted that the Sisters of Providence were "on a roll."

August, the month of the community's annual gathering days, included the Jubilee celebration for 11 sisters celebrating 25, 50, 60 and 70 years of religious life. Next came the profession of first vows by Salvadoran native Sister Margarita Hernandez. Then, in September, Sisters Gabrielle Nguyen, a native of Vietnam, and Ana Dolores Orellana, another Salvadoran, completed their transfer of vows into the community.

The vow ceremonies, in which each sister dedicated her life to serving the poor, celebrated the culture of each sister and reflected that this is an international community of joyful women of faith. SISTERS OF PROVIDENCE, SAINT MARY-OF-THE-WOODS, IND.

### **Church Centennial Celebration**

The Sisters of Providence of Saint Mary-of-the-Woods, Ind., began a year-long celebration Oct. 21 for the 100th anniversary of the consecration of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, on the mother-house grounds. The Church has a cathedral-like appearance, having been fashioned

after the Church of the Holy Trinity in Paris.

The year commemorates "church as people" and "church as building." To that end, several events are planned which celebrate both aspects of this significant anniversary.

#### Church as people

The anniversary year opened with Eucharistic Liturgy Oct. 21, as worshippers gathered in the church as they have for more than 100 years to offer praise and gratitude to God. Sisters of Providence in the assembly remembered other celebrations in this hallowed spot: ceremonies of entrance into the Congregation; profession of vows; jubilees; gathering for prayer to begin General Chapters, assemblies and the centennial/sesquicentennial years; and assembling for funerals in celebration of the life of countless sister companions.

Others who assembled may have reflected on times when they gathered with the sisters for Sunday Liturgy, ecumenical observances or came to pray after 9/11 or assembled for prayerful witness against the death

> penalty or came just to enjoy the beauty of the church.

A Centenary Organ Concert sponsored by the Wabash Valley Chapter of the American Guild of Organists was held in the church that afternoon.
