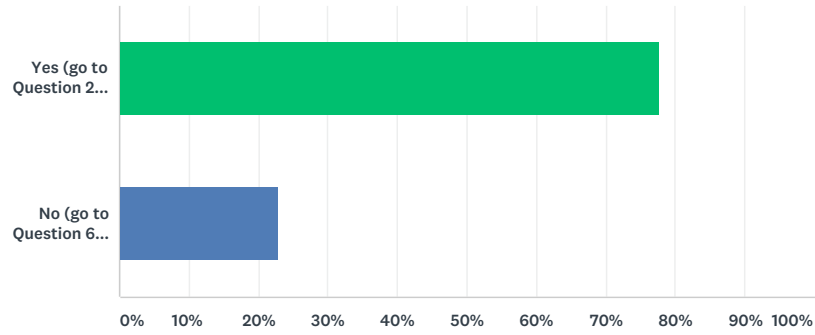


### Q1 Have you ever attended a Providence Event?

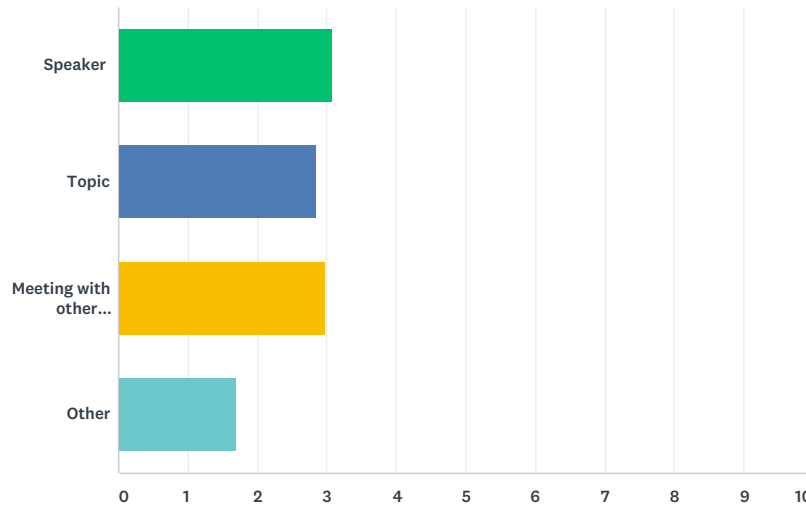

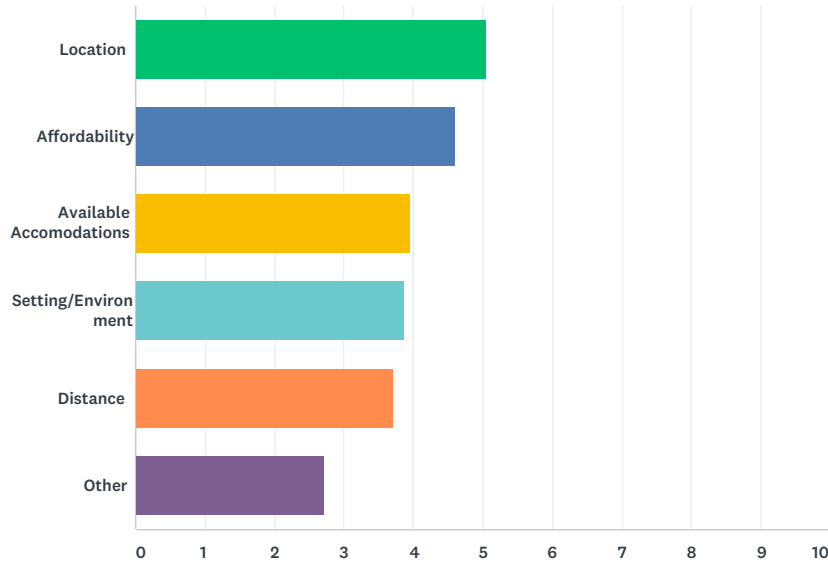

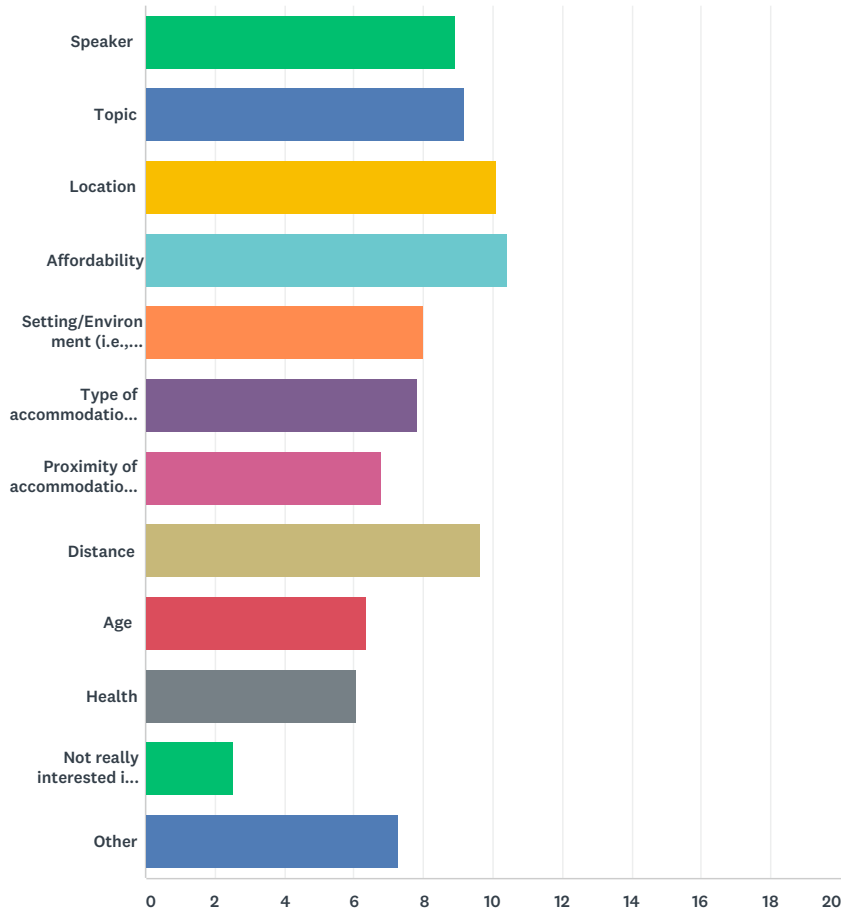

In our Congregation, the practice has been for people to be chosen to go to this event. I have never been chosen even when expressing an interest in going.

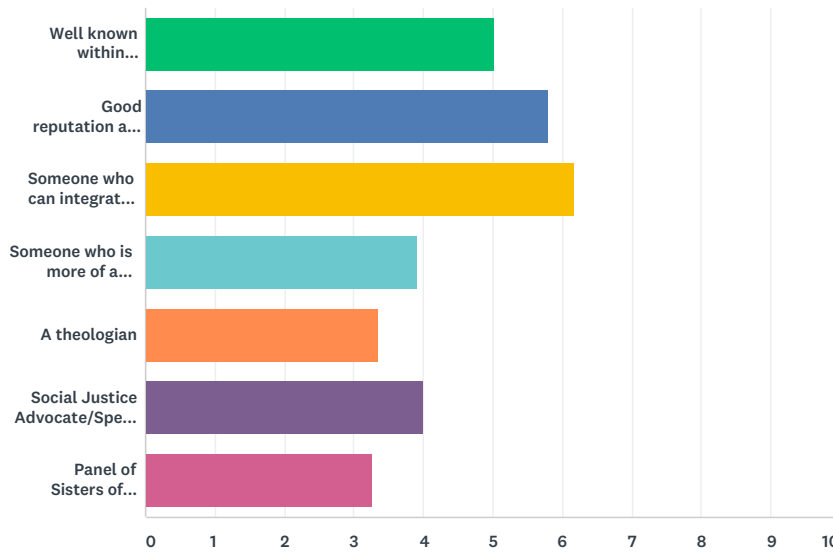

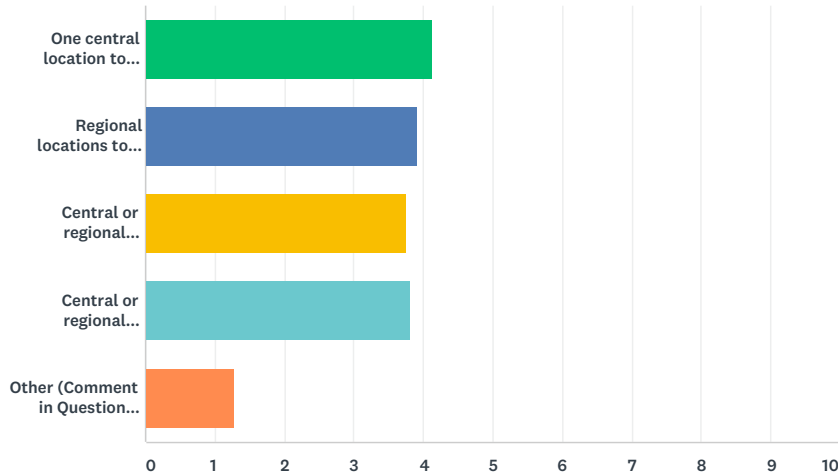

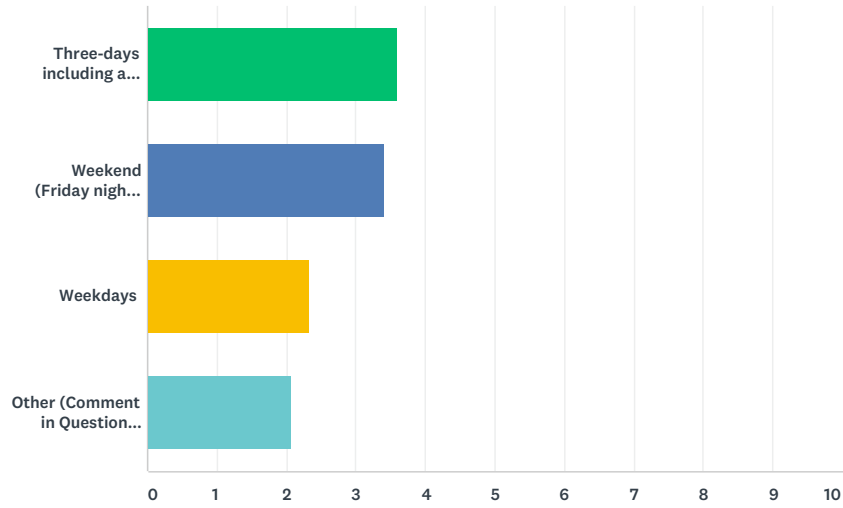

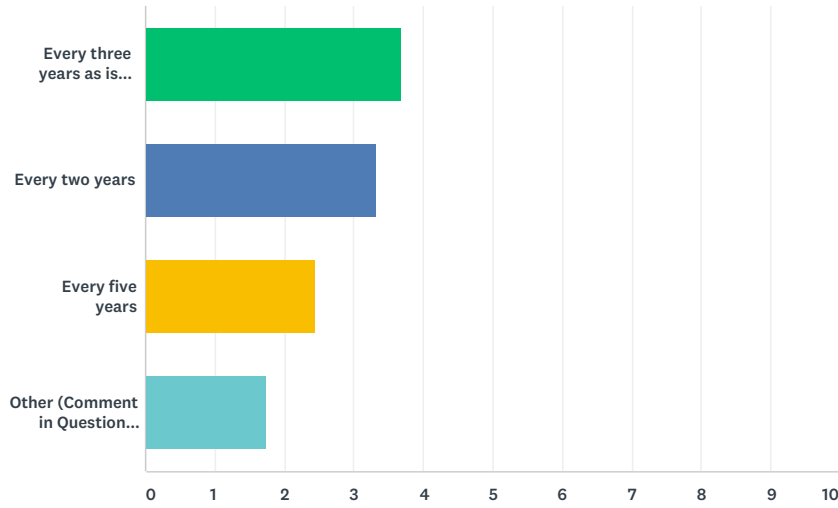

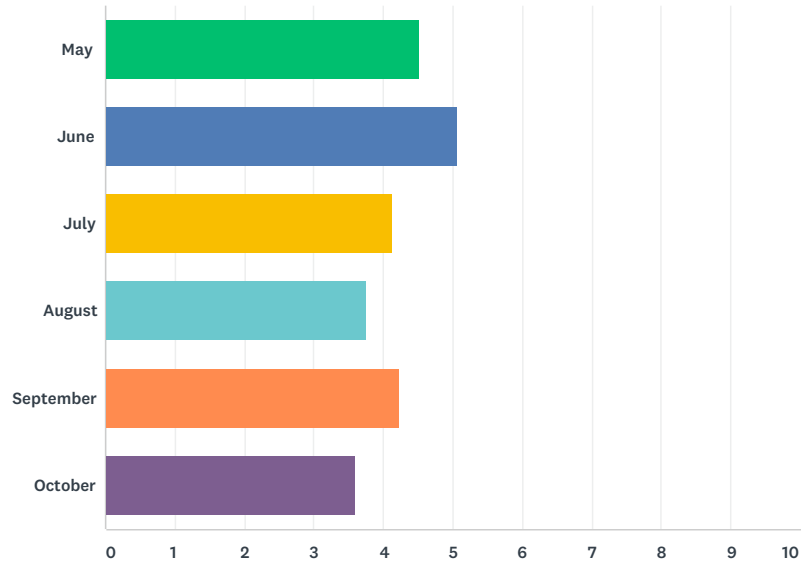
Time of year is important since many have "ordinary" times for meetings, vows, etc.

### Q17 Best time of year for an event [Rank 1st choice as 1, 2nd choice as 2, etc.]

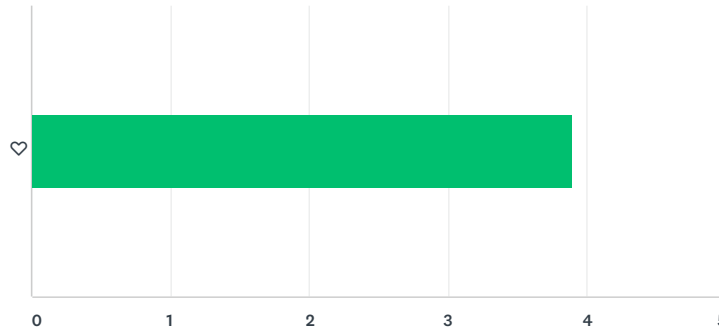

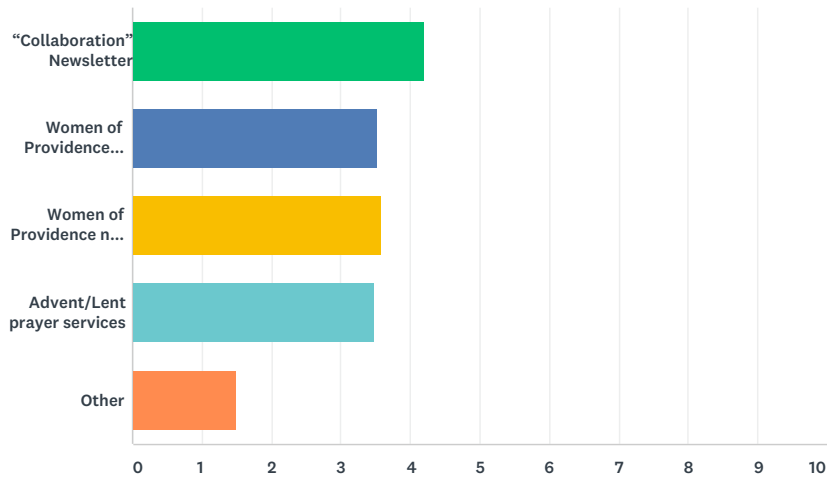
